#### Water Boundaries

Water boundaries are always contentious and they do not easily fit with our otherwise precise cadastral record. Conflict about use of land adjoining a river has required the Court of Appeal to clarify how the bank of a river can be identified. The definition emphasises physical observation, rather than measurements and calculations about water flows.

#### Māori Land


