Adolescent smoking in New Zealand's Pasifika: differences by ethnicity

Dalice Sim

We examined the strength and prevalence of key risk factors in New Zealand Pasifika adolescents compared to non-Māori, non-Pasifika (NMNP). Although the odds ratios were similar or lower than those for NMNP for many risk factors, because of the higher prevalence for Pasifika, the population attributable risk was **higher or similar** for all Pasifika groups than for NMNP.



Dalice studied statistics at the University of Auckland, before getting her PhD in Biostatistics at the University of Washington with Professor Norman Breslow. She has worked in medical statistics at Arizona Cancer Centre, University of Western Ontario, and at Victoria University of Wellington before joining University of Otago in 2015. Her interests are in clinical trials and preventive statistics.
